

## **Gabriel Commons Pool Rules** Revised December 2017

### **Prohibited in the Pool Area**

- Diving into any area of the pool
- Food **in** the pool
- Glass/breakable containers
- Children under 14 unaccompanied by an adult (over 18)
- Animals
- Loud music
- Objects that do not float **in** the pool
- Swimming when the pool is closed.

### **Cleanliness**

- Tie up long hair or cover with a bathing cap
- Apply sun block **after** swimming, not before
- Babies must wear special swim diapers
- Clean up your own food/beverages; don't leave trash in the pool area.
- No smoking in the pool area

### **Consideration for Others**

- No yelling or excessively loud talking
- No water toys in the pool when nonparticipating swimmers are present.
- Exception: non-swimmers may wear flotation devices.
- Do not monopolize the pool with any kind of activity that makes it impossible, unpleasant, or intimidating for others to enjoy the area

### **Responsibility**

- Residents are responsible for their own safety and that of their children and guests; the Gabriel Commons Association is not responsible for accidents.

### **Pool Parties**

- Any resident may reserve the pool for a two-hour swimming party any day of the week.
- Reservations must be made seven days in advance with the Pool Chairperson (or designee) using the form available in the pool house.

### **Non-Resident Guests Use of the Swimming Pool:**

#### **Conditions for Granting Non-Resident Guests Admission to the Pool**

- Non- residents may use the pool when accompanied by owners.
- Non-residents, unaccompanied by owners, may use the pool under the following conditions:
  - A. Basic requirements: Guests must be either
    1. Adult children (and grandchildren supervised by them) of the resident host
    2. Parents, siblings or other close adult relatives of resident host
    3. Adult house sitters. [Adult = age 18 or older] of the resident host
  - B. Resident host prints a "Non-Resident Guest Authorization Request" form, fills it out and submits it to the Pool Committee designee for approval.
  - C. The request is reviewed by the Pool Committee and the decision is communicated to the resident host.
  - D. Approved names of the non-resident guests will be posted at the pool house. Names will be placed on a list for future reference.
